The Government of India introduced, initiated and implemented a number of policy solutions which have been talked about and implemented for Security of Women since its inception. There are Constitutional Provisions, Acts, Policies and Legal Provisions in India for the security and empowerment of women. Besides that technological inventions like 'Panic Buttons', GPS tracking, and CCTVs also introduced.

Women's Security involves Social, Economic and Political security. Therefore planning and policy around security should always involve and consider women in these three zones.

Social security means avoiding discrimination and violence against women in the name of gender, it involves safety at work place and in society also. Women's social security involves strategies and policies that take place before violence has occurred to prevent perpetration or victimization. This can happen by improving knowledge and attitudes that correspond to the origins of domestic or sexual violence, such as adherence to societal norms supportive of violence, male superiority and male sexual entitlement.

Economic security involves freedom from poverty. This includes safe access to education, employment which means financial security and autonomy. Women's economic empowerment reduces their vulnerability to situations of violence as they become less dependent on men and better able to make their own decisions. Political security is important among all. Women's participation as representatives of women in Assemblies and Parliament is must. Participation in local governments also must be pursued, and including a full diversity of women and girls in local decision-making processes must be promoted.
